ABOUT THIS MANUAL

Purpose

This manual describes the assembly, installation, operation and troubleshooting of this unit. Please read this manual carefully before installations and operations. Keep this manual for future reference.

Scope

This manual provides safety and installation guidelines as well as information on tools and wiring.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS



WARNING: This chapter contains important safety and operating instructions. Read and keep this manual for future reference.

- 1. Before using the unit, read all instructions and cautionary markings on the unit, the batteries and all appropriate sections of this manual.
- 2. CAUTION—To reduce risk of injury, charge only deep-cycle lead acid type rechargeable batteries.
- 3. Do not try to repair or open the unit. Take it to a qualified service center when needed .Incorrect installation may result in a risk of electric shock or fire.
- 4. Disconnect all wirings before attempting any maintenance or cleaning.
- 5. CAUTION Only qualified personnel can install and troubleshoot this inverter.
- 6. NEVER charge a frozen battery.
- 7. For optimum operation of this hybrid inverter, please follow required spec to select appropriate cable size. It's very important to correctly operate this hybrid inverter.
- 8. Be very cautious when working with metal wrist watch and tools on or around batteries. A potential risk exists for short circuit batteries terminals with explosion.
- 9. Please strictly follow installation procedure when you want to disconnect AC or DC connectors.
- 10. This hybrid inverter should be connected to a permanent grounded wiring system.

INTRODUCTION

This is a pure sine wave stand-alone hybrid inverter system combining the function of inverter, AC charger and optional solar charger, and provides a long run-time uninterruptible power supply. Its comprehensive LCD display provides system status, and user-friendly panel eases parameters settings.

Features

- High-frequency switching technology, compact size and light weight
- · Pure sine wave output for wide range of applications
- Build-in solar charger controller with MPPT technology to optimize the power utilization (some models don't have this option)
- Efficient DC-to-AC conversion minimizing energy loss
- Standby Charging Mode enables battery charging even when the unit is switched off
- Intelligent cooling fan control
- Input/ output isolated design for the maximum operation safety
- LCD displays for detailed status
- Configurable AC input voltage range and priority for AC or PV input
- Supports Home Appliances / Office Equipment/ Lighting Equipment/ Motor-based Equipment (such as Fan, Air-Conditioner, Washing Machines etc)
- Input low voltage / Overload / Short circuit / Low battery alarm / Input over voltage / Over temperature protections.
- Supports both rack and wall-mount installation

Basic System Architecture

The following illustration shows basic application for this hybrid inverter. It also includes following devices to have a complete running system:

- Ÿ Generator or Utility.
- Ÿ PV modules

Consult with your system integrator for other possible system architectures depending on your requirements.

This inverter can power all kinds of appliances in home or office environment, including motor-type appliances such as tube light, fan, refrigerator and air conditioner.

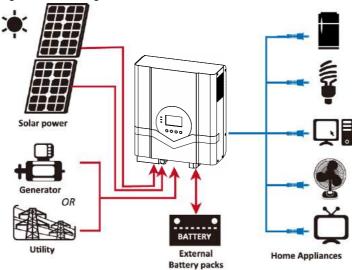
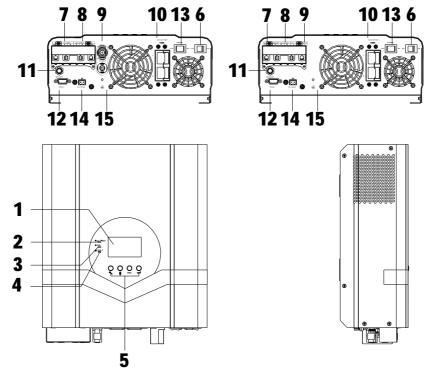
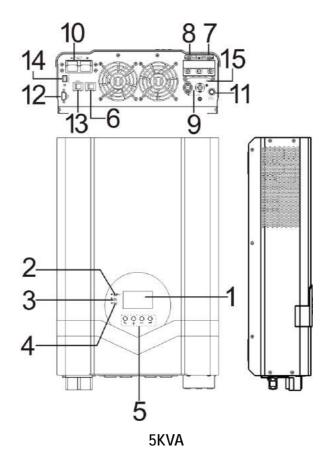


Figure 1 Hybrid Power System

INSTALLATION

Unpacking and Inspection

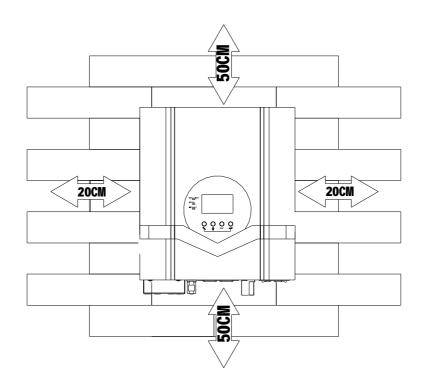
Before installation, please inspect the unit. Be sure that nothing inside the package is damaged. You should have received the following items inside the box:

- Ÿ The unit x 1
- Ÿ User manual x 1
- Ÿ Ring terminal x 1
- Ÿ Strain relief plate x 2
- Ϋ́ Terminal cover x 1
- ÿ Screws x 4

Mounting the Unit

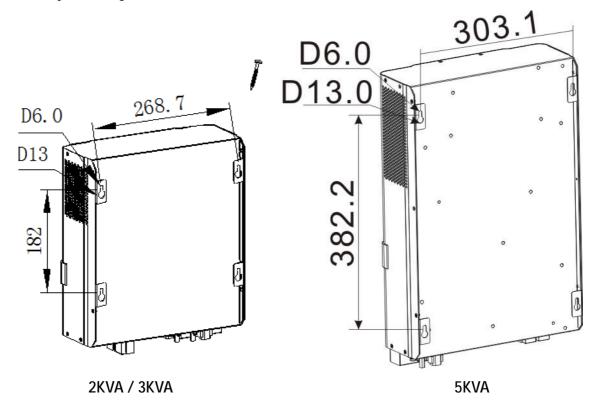
Consider the following points before selecting where to install:

- Ÿ Do not mount the inverter on flammable construction materials.
- Ÿ Mount on a solid surface
- Ÿ Install this inverter at eye level in order to allow the LCD display to be read at all times.
- Ÿ For proper air circulation to dissipate heat, allow a clearance of approx. 20 cm to the side and approx. 50 cm above and below the unit.
- Ÿ The ambient temperature should be between 0°C and 45°C to ensure optimal operation,
- Ÿ The recommended installation position is to be adhered to the wall vertically.
- Ÿ Be sure to keep other objects and surfaces as shown in the diagram to guarantee sufficient heat dissipation and to have enough space for removing wires.



⚠ SUITABLE FOR MOUNTING ON CONCRETE OR OTHER NON-COMBUSTIBLE SURFACE ONLY.

Install the unit by screwing two screws. It's recommended to use M4 or M5 screws.



Battery Connection

CAUTION: For safety operation and regulation compliance; it's requested to install a separate DC over-current protector or disconnect device between battery and inverter. It may not be requested to have a disconnect device in some applications, however, it's still requested to have over-current protection installed. Please refer to typical amperage in below table as required fuse or breaker size. WARNING! All wiring must be performed by qualified personnel.

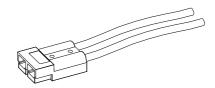
WARNING! It's very important for system safety and efficient operation to use appropriate cable for

battery connection. To reduce risk of injury, please use recommended cable as below. Recommended battery cable size:

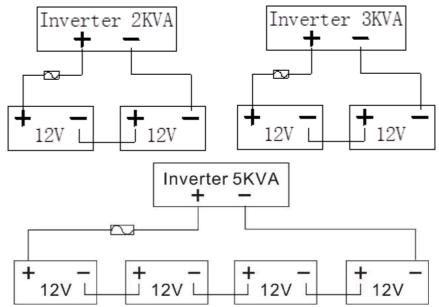

Please follow below steps to implement battery connection:

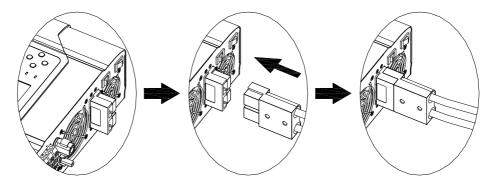
- 1. Remove insulation sleeve for positive and negative conductors, refer to the appropriate sleeve length in the table.
- 2. Put bootlace ferrules on the end of positive and negative wires with a proper crimping tool.



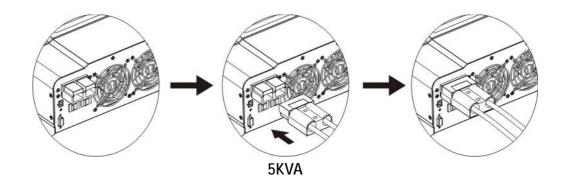
3. Connect all battery packs as below chart.



4. Insert the battery wires terminal into battery connectors of inverter Make sure polarity at both the battery and the inverter/charge is correctly connected.

WARNING: Shock Hazard

Installation must be performed with care due to high battery voltage in series.



CAUTION!! Before making the final DC connection or closing DC breaker/disconnector, be sure positive (+) must be connected to positive (+) and negative (-) must be connected to negative (-) terminal.

AC input/output Connection

CAUTION!! Before connecting to AC input power source, please install a separate AC breaker between inverter and AC input power source. This will ensure the inverter can be securely disconnected during maintenance and fully protected from over current of AC input. The recommended spec of AC breaker is 25A for 2KVA, 32A for 3KVA and 40A for 5KVA.

CAUTION!!Terminal blocks are with "AC INPUT" and "AC OUTPUT" marking always check labels to avoid wrong connection.

WARNING! All wiring must be performed by qualified personnel.

WARNING! It's very important for system safety and efficient operation to use appropriate cable for AC input connection. Always use recommended AC cable size as below.

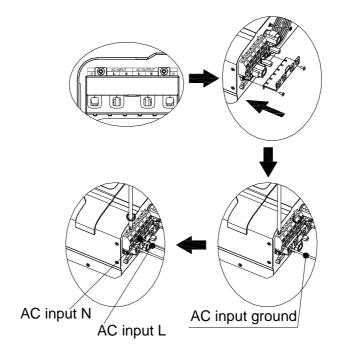

Please follow below steps to implement AC input/output connection:

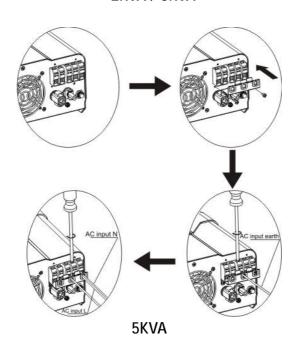
- 1. Before making AC input/output connection, be sure to open DC protector or disconnector first.
- Remove insulation sleeve 8mm for six conductors. And shorten phase L and neutral conductor N 3 mm.
- 3. Fix strain relief plate
- 4. Insert AC input wires according to polarities indicated on terminal block and tighten the terminal screws. Be sure to connect PE protective conductor () first.
 - ⊕→Ground (yellow-green)

L→LINE (brown or black)

N→Neutral (blue)



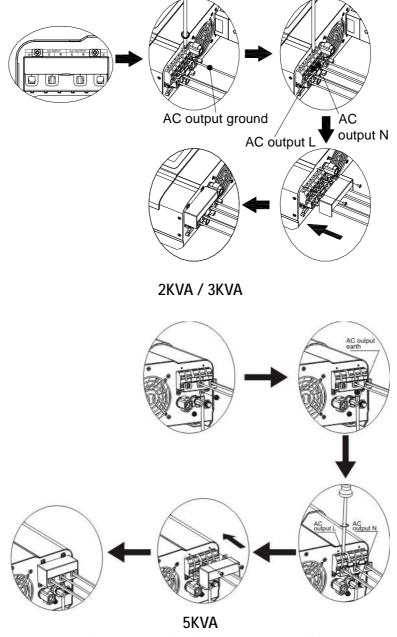

WARNING:

Be sure that AC power source is disconnected before attempting to hardwire it to the unit



5. Make sure the wires are securely connected and the cover is fixed by screw.

PV Connection

CAUTION: Before connecting to PV modules, please install separately a DC circuit breaker between inverter and PV modules.

WARNING! It's very important for system safety and efficient operation to use appropriate cable for PV module connection. To reduce risk of injury, please use the proper recommended cable size as below.

PV Module Selection: (Only for the model with MPPT solar charger)

When selecting proper PV modules, please be sure to consider below parameters:

- 1. Open circuit Voltage (Voc) of PV modules not exceeds max. PV array open circuit voltage of inverter.
- 2. Open circuit Voltage (Voc) of PV modules should be higher than min, battery voltage.

Take 250Wp PV module as an example. After considering above two parameters, the recommended module configurations for 3KVA are listed as below table.

PV Module Selection: (Only for the model with MPPT solar charger)

When selecting proper PV modules, please be sure to consider below parameters:

- 1. Open circuit Voltage (Voc) of PV modules not exceeds max. PV array open circuit voltage of inverter.
- 2. Open circuit Voltage (Voc) of PV modules should be higher than min, battery voltage.

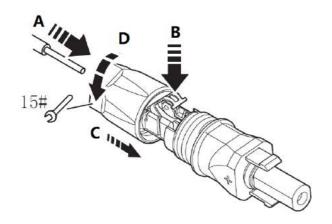

PV Module Wire Connection

Please follow below steps to implement PV module connection:

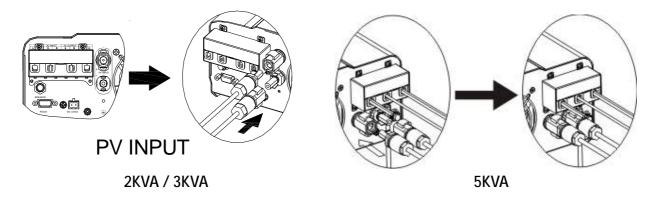
1. Wire connection of the connector:



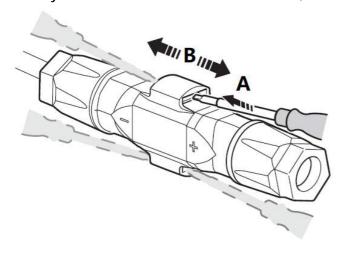
A. Insert the stripped conductor.

Cross-sections: 2.5 to 62 mm. Outside diameter: 5.0 to 8.0 mm. Stripping length: 15 mm.

- B. Close spring with the thumb or using combination pliers. Please ensure that the spring is closed. (see Fig.)
- C. Push connectors together (see Fig.)
- D. Screw cable gland tight. Screw in the nut until it reaches the O-ring and then tighten it with at least 2 Nm using a suitable tool. Finished!
- 2. Check correct polarity of wire connection from PV modules and PV input connectors. Then, connect positive pole (+) of connection wire to positive pole (+) of PV input connector. Connect negative pole (-) of connection wire to negative pole (-) of PV input connector.



3. If you need disconnect the PV connector, follow below steps and refer to the below Fig.



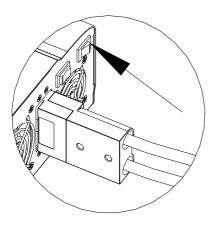
- A. Insert screwdriver SZF1 or phase tester in one of the illustrated positions.
- B. Leave screw driver inserted and remove connector from socket.

Final Assembly

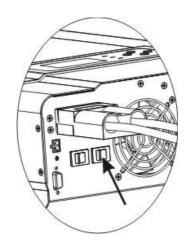
After connecting all wirings, before turning on the unit, please check the position of maintenance switch. Put the switch to "NORMAL" position if not. Other position of the switch like "INV" or "SCC" is used for only service purpose.

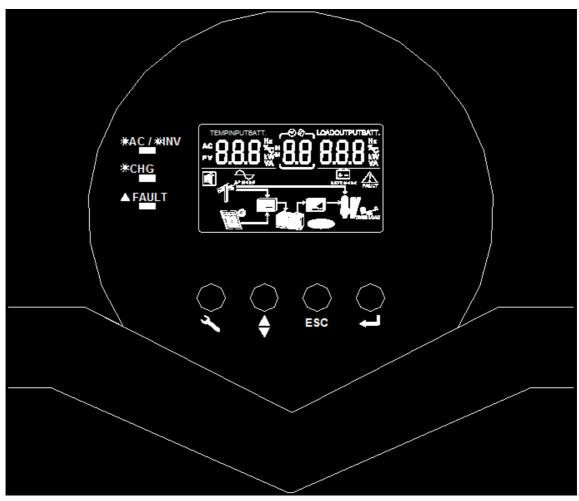

Once the unit has been properly installed and the batteries are connected well, simply press On/Off switch (located on the button of the case) to turn on the unit.

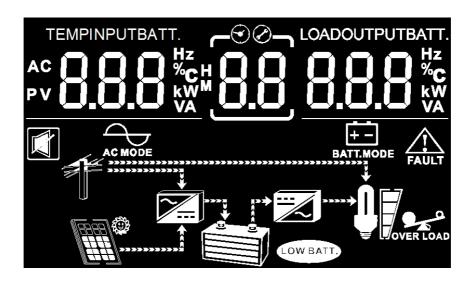

LCD Setting

After pressing and holding "Configuration" button for 1 second, the unit will enter setting mode and switch between different setting items. Press "Up/down" button to switch between different setting parameters. And then, press "ENTER" button to confirm the selection or ESC button to exit.

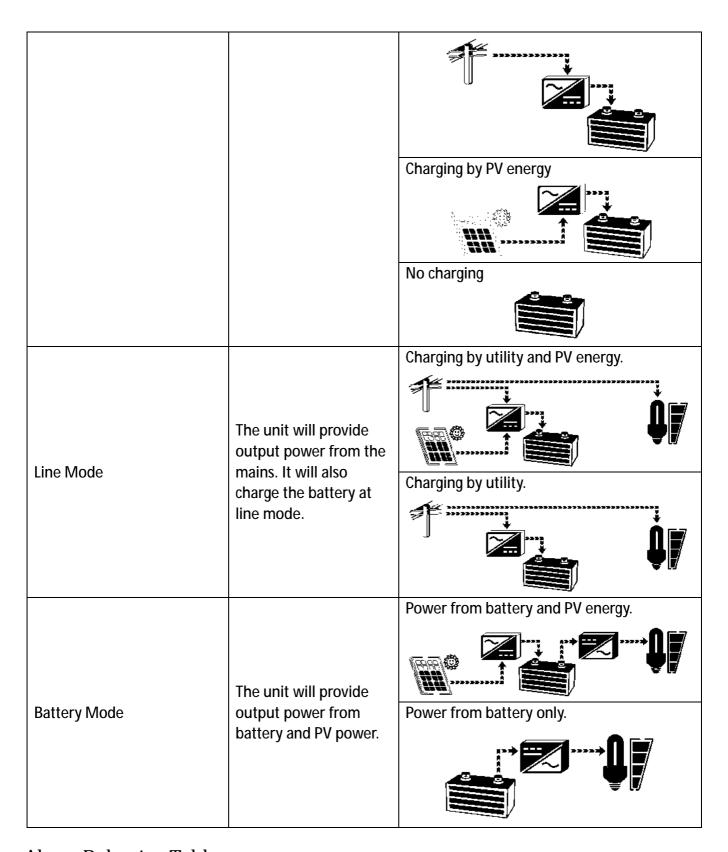

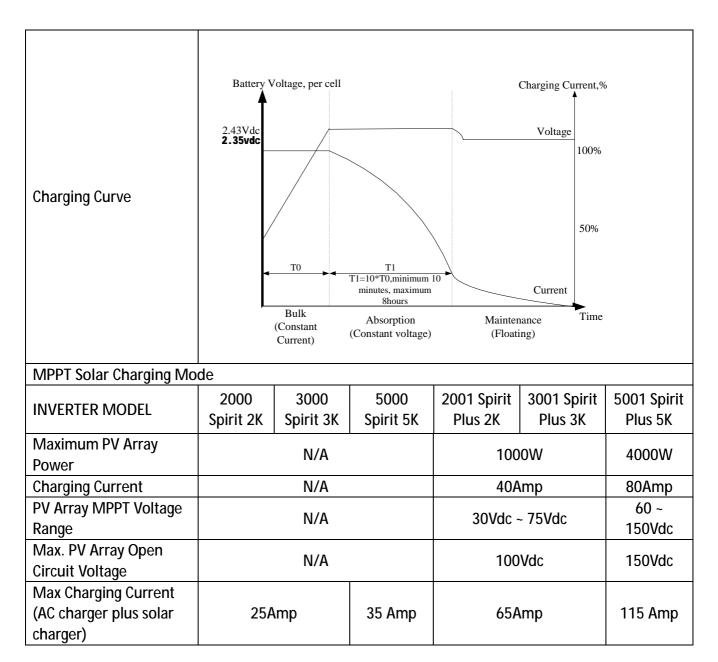
